In addition, there are numerous other speakers and topics that will provide useful and interesting information in "crossover" sections of the Symposium—e.g. the forages, stock dog, and sheep sections of the Symposium.

In addition to practical talks for producers, the Symposium also features a sold out ag-related trade show, country music entertainer John Anderson, and even some free meals!
